



RC questions can be divided into:

- ❖ **Inference Questions:** Require interpreting or concluding something not directly stated.
- ❖ **Main Idea Questions:** Test your understanding of the passage's overall purpose or theme.
- ❖ **Vocabulary Questions:** Focus on the meaning of words or phrases in context.
- ❖ **Tone/Attitude Questions:** Ask about the author's perspective or sentiment.

## 6. Answer Choices

- ❖ Often include **one correct answer and several distractors** (wrong options).
- ❖ Distractors are designed to test your attention to detail and reasoning.

Tips to Approach RC Structure:

- ❖ **Preview the Passage:** Skim for structure—identify the introduction, body, and conclusion.
- ❖ **Focus on the Main Idea:** Keep returning to it while answering questions.
- ❖ **Look for Transition Words:** Words like *however, therefore, in contrast* signal shifts in arguments or ideas.
- ❖ **Pay Attention to the Author's Tone:** This can guide you in inference and attitude-based questions.

## C. Types of Passages and Questions

### 1. Types of Questions

Notice the writing style: Is it formal, informal, sarcastic, or earnest? The style can help you understand the author's approach and tone. Authors often state their purpose directly or indirectly. Phrases like "This essay aims to..." or "The purpose of this study is..." can guide you in understanding the intent. For example, in a passage stating, "Despite numerous efforts, the results were disappointing," the word "disappointing" indicates a negative tone, which helps in answering questions about the author's perspective on the results.

### 5. Vocabulary Challenges

Encountering unfamiliar words can hinder understanding and slow down your reading pace.

**Solution:** Use context clues to determine the meaning of unfamiliar words by looking at how they are used in the sentence. Surrounding words and sentences can provide hints. Regularly read a variety of texts and note down new words. Use flashcards or vocabulary apps to review and reinforce your learning. Recognize root words, prefixes, and suffixes in complex words to help infer their meanings. If you encounter a difficult word, don't let it stop you. Move on and return to it if necessary,

using the overall context to make an educated guess. For example, in the sentence “The arboreal creature leapt gracefully from branch to branch,” you might not know “arboreal,” but “creature” and “branch” suggest it relates to trees, helping you infer that “arboreal” means living in trees.



In retrospect, watching all nine seasons of the original *Dynasty* (ABC, 1981-89) was a strange choice. I was looking for something escapist, a wormhole to a parallel universe that seemed somewhat less on the verge of apocalypse than our own, and nostalgia seemed like as good a route as any. Of course, this wasn't a plan of my own invention: nostalgia is a well-established marketing strategy, a way to produce brand loyalty retroactively, and thus the reboot of *Dynasty* on the CW network (2017-) is certainly in part responsible for my indulgence in the original. *Dynasty*, *Dallas*, *Falcon Crest*—all those prime-time soaps of the 1980s glorifying

a uniquely American conception of fantastic wealth and provincial royalty—were a televisual version of the 1980s that I had missed at the time, and which now felt like something I was missing. Certainly, I was familiar with some of it through cultural osmosis: I knew that *Dallas* featured "J. R." who was shot at some point, and that *Dynasty* was defined by Joan Collins and the name "Carrington." In other words, I knew the brands. My initial enchantment with (re)visiting the *Dynasty* of the 1980s was predicated on looking at it as a series of hilariously unconnected dots, none of which I wanted to think about beyond their obvious absurdity. The series is itself so narratively incoherent that it allows for the brief illusion that it has no continuity with anything at all. But the moment I was asked to contextualize my viewing experience, the fun was sucked right out of it. The world of *Dynasty* is not, in fact, a parallel universe. Despite its internal incoherence, *Dynasty* is part of a narrative that, no matter how ridiculous the premise, has the vicious coherence of history. Connecting the dots leads right to here and now, where virtually no one wants to be. *Dynasty* is part of the fantasy world out of which Donald Trump oozed, and through which America became willing to watch him as if he were worth looking at. Overlapping with the show's nine-year run was Trump's increasingly successful mission to spread his name like a disease, putting his vile mark on hotels and racism like he was pissing on fire hydrants. It was not new that people looked at rich people solely because they were rich, and it was not the first time that a family brand in the United States was formed through an alchemical mix of self-congratulation and racist pandering. But the 1980s were a time when global capitalism and the promotion of American "family values" might have emerged as logically opposed, but were instead married by branding, in lieu of sense.
