EXPLANATION

1. (c) Pooja Gehlot is an Indian wrestler who competed in the 2022 Commonwealth Games.

She did not win a gold medal at the 2022 Commonwealth Games.

Pooja Gehlot, however, secured a bronze medal in the Women's Freestyle 50kg category.

Other Indian wrestlers such as Naveen Kumar, Ravi Dahiya, and Vinesh Phogat won gold medals in their respective categories.

2. (b) The WACA (Western Australian Cricket Association) Ground is a sports stadium in Perth, Western Australia.

It has been the "home of cricket" in Western Australia since the early 1890s.

The WACA Ground has hosted Test matches, One Day Internationals, and Twenty20 Internationals as well as other sports events.

3. (d) Chauri Chaura is a town in the Gorakhpur district of the Indian state of Uttar Pradesh.

The Chauri Chaura incident took place on February 4, 1922, during the Non-Cooperation Movement led by Mahatma Gandhi.

In this incident, a large group of protesters clashed with the police, leading to the police station being set on fire and resulting in the deaths of 22 policemen.

4. (b) The general circulation of the atmosphere refers to the large-scale movement of air through the planet's troposphere.

It encompasses the global patterns of wind that are primarily driven by the uneven heating of the Earth's surface.

These wind patterns are responsible for the distribution of heat and moisture around the globe.

These wind belts arise due to the Earth's rotation, solar heating, and Coriolis effect, and are part of the three-cell model: Hadley Cell, Ferrel Cell, and Polar Cell.

5. (d) The term 'secular' was added to the Preamble of the Constitution of India by the

42nd Constitutional Amendment Act in the year 1976.

The Constitution of India was adopted on 26 November 1949 by the Constituent Assembly and came into force on 26 January 1950. After the 42nd amendment, three new terms "Socialist, Secular, and Integrity" were added to the Preamble.

6. (c) During the Mughal period, Khud Kashta referred to farmers who cultivated their own land and lived in the same village.

They were different from Pahi Kashtas who cultivated the land of others and were often tenants or sharecroppers.

Khud Kashta farmers were typically more stable and had more rights over the land compared to other categories of farmers.

7. (a) The demand for 'Swaraj' was first put forward in the Calcutta session of the Indian National Congress in 1906. This session laid the foundation for the future struggle for complete independence from British rule.

This session was presided over by Dadabhai Naoroji, who was a prominent leader and played a significant role in the Indian freedom struggle.

The term 'Swaraj' means self-rule or self-governance, and it marked a significant shift in the Indian National Congress's approach towards the British rule.

8. (a) Tippani is a folk dance that originated in the Veraval and Chorwad regions of Saurashtra, Gujarat.

It involves the use of a long stick, known as Tippani, which is hit rhythmically on the ground or on a wooden board.

This dance is usually performed by women and is often a part of wedding celebrations and other festive occasions in Gujarat.

9. (d) The World Trade Organization (WTO) is headquartered in Geneva, Switzerland. The WTO officially commenced on 1 January 1995 under the Marrakesh Agreement, replacing the General Agreement on Tariffs and Trade (GATT), which commenced in 1948.

The organization deals with the global rules of trade between nations and aims to ensure that trade flows as smoothly, predictably, and freely as possible.

It currently has 166 member states, representing over 98% of world trade, and its top decision-making body is the Ministerial Conference which meets every two years.

10. (b) Sarojini Naidu was an Indian independence activist, poet, and politician. She became the first Indian woman to be the President of the Indian National Congress in 1925.

Sarojini Naidu was also known as the 'Nightingale of India' for her contributions to poetry.

She played a significant role in the Civil Disobedience Movement and the Quit India Movement.

11. (a) Polysiphonia is a genus of red algae (Rhodophyceae) known for its complex life cycle and filamentous structure.

It possesses an erect series of branches and a filamentous prostrate section attached to the substratum by means of unicellular rhizoids. The genus is typically found in marine environments, often in intertidal zones and shallow waters.

Polysiphonia species are important for studying the reproductive biology and development of red algae.

12. (c) Article 18 of the Constitution of India prohibits the state from conferring any titles except those related to Military and Academic distinctions.

Military titles could include ranks such as General, Colonel, etc., which are essential for the structure and functioning of the armed forces.

Academic titles could include degrees such as Doctor, Professor, etc., which acknowledge educational and scholarly achievements.

13. (b) In chess, the board is divided into 64 squares arranged in an 8x8 grid.

The vertical columns of squares are called "files" and are labeled from 'a' to 'h'. The horizontal rows of squares are called "ranks" and are numbered from 1 to 8.

Each square on the chessboard is uniquely identified by a combination of its file and rank, for example, e4, d5, etc.

14. (d) The Swaran Singh Committee, constituted in 1976, recommended the inclusion of 8 Fundamental Duties in the Constitution of India.

Based on its recommendations, the 42nd Constitutional Amendment Act, 1976 added Article 51A to the Constitution, incorporating 10 Fundamental Duties (Parliament added 2 more during the drafting).

Later, the 86th Amendment Act, 2002 added the 11th duty.

15. (c) The Green Revolution in India had the following limitations:

Confined to limited crops:

The benefits were mostly seen in wheat and rice, especially in regions like Punjab, Haryana, and western Uttar Pradesh.

Uneven spread:

The revolution was regionally concentrated, with limited impact in eastern and southern states and minimal benefits to small and marginal farmers.

Hence, both A and B are correct limitations of the Green Revolution.

16. (a) The New India Literacy Programme (NILP) is a five-year centrally sponsored scheme launched from FY 2022–23 to FY 2026–27.

The scheme aims to cover a target of 5.00 crore non-literates in the age group of 15 years and above.

The Scheme has five components: (i) Foundational Literacy and Numeracy, (ii) Critical Life Skills, (iii) Vocational Skills Development, (iv) Basic Education and (v) Continuing Education.

17. (c) The Annual Financial Statement (AFS) gives a comprehensive summary of the estimated revenue and expenditure of the government for a financial year.

It is presented by the Finance Minister of India in Parliament, typically on the first day of February.

The AFS is divided into three parts: the Consolidated Fund, the Contingency Fund, and the Public Account of India.

This document includes estimates of expenditure and receipts for both the current and the upcoming fiscal years.

18. (b) The Self-Help Group–Bank Linkage Programme (SHG–BLP) was initiated as a pilot project by NABARD in 1992, and based on its success, three key innovations were introduced by NABARD/RBI:

Acceptance of informal groups (SHGs) as clients of banks for both savings and credit. Collateral-free lending to SHGs.

No specification of purpose/activity/project required for lending.

However, "Avoidance of action in the event of defaults" is not part of the innovations.

19. (d) Pandit Ajoy Chakrabarty is a renowned Indian classical vocalist who belongs to the Patiala-Kasur gharana and conferred with the Padma Bhushan in 2020 for his contributions to Indian classical music.

He has received several prestigious awards including the Padma Shri (2011), Sangeet Natak Akademi Award (Delhi, 1999–2000), and National Tansen Samman 2015 - by the Chief Minister of Madhya Pradesh.

Patiala Gharana is known for its distinctive style of singing, particularly in the use of intricate and fast-paced taans (rapid fire notes).

20. (b) Indian Foreign Services (IFS) and Indian Revenue Services (IRS) are classified as Central services.

These services come under the umbrella of the Indian Civil Services, which are managed by the Union Government of India. Central services are responsible for the administration of the central government departments and policies in various fields. They are distinct from All India Services (like IAS and IPS) which operate under both the Centre and States.

21. (c) The liberalization policy in India focused significantly on the industrial sector to encourage private participation and reduce government control and Financial sector reforms to enhance the efficiency of the financial system, including banking and capital markets.

These reforms were designed to boost economic efficiency, make India more competitive globally, attract foreign investment, and connect the Indian economy with the global market.











22. (c) Prarthana Samaj was founded in 1867 by Atmaram Pandurang in Bombay (now Mumbai).

The Samaj aimed to make social reforms in Hindu society by introducing rational and humanistic principles.

It was inspired by the Brahmo Samaj and worked towards abolishing caste discrimination and promoting women's education.

Notable figures like Justice Mahadev Govind Ranade and R. G. Bhandarkar were actively involved in the Samaj.

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
